Welcome to the latest edition of the Wrexham and District National Eisteddfod newsletter, and at last – after all the waiting – 2011 has arrived and the Eisteddfod is fast approaching,

Some closing dates have already passed, and the closing date for the Science and Technology Medal and the Sir T H Parry Williams Memorial Medal is at the end of the month.

The Science and Technology Medal is an opportunity to honour individuals who have contributed extensively in the area of Science and Technology through

the medium of Welsh. The nomination form is available to download from the Eisteddfod website – [www.eisteddfod.org.uk](http://www.eisteddfod.org.uk) – or you can contact the office for a copy. All completed forms must reach the Organiser by 31 January 2011.

31 January is also the closing date for nominations for the Sir T H Parry Williams Memorial Medal, presented annually to an individual who has worked tirelessly to help young people in their local community for many years, making a real difference to their lives. The Medal is presented in memory of Sir T H Parry Williams, a great supporter of the Eisteddfod for many years. #### Appeal for caravans

During the National Eisteddfod it is estimated that 150,000 – 160,000 people will visit the Festival site. Although we hope that many local people will attend thousands will come from further afield and will be looking for accommodation in the area – in hotels, guest houses, bed and breakfast and also in private accommodation. Every year hundreds of caravanners will also set up home on the Eisteddfod's caravan site, which will be situated next to the Eisteddfod Festival site at Lower Berse Farm on the outskirts of Wrexham. Some will bring their own caravans while others will be looking for caravans to rent for the week.

We have already received numerous requests for caravans from people wishing to stay on the caravan site but do not have their own caravans to bring.
